

## **RICHARD H. TATLOW, IV**

June 30, 1939- September 17, 2022



Richard “Dick” Tatlow, passed away peacefully in Scottsdale, Arizona, following a wonderful 83 year adventure. Dick was born in Washington, DC, raised in Scarsdale, NY, later moving to Bronxville, NY, until he and his wife, Pat, moved to Carefree, Arizona, in 1998 and eventually retiring.

Dick graduated from Cornell University School of Civil Engineering in 1961. In 1964, he received his M.B.A from the University of Virginia Graduate School of Business Administration. He remained active in both the Cornell and Darden communities as an alumnus throughout his life, serving in a number of leadership roles.

From 1965-1966, Dick was a commissioned officer, with the Army Corps of Engineers in Vietnam, at the rank of First Lieutenant, then Captain. Upon returning from the Army, Dick joined his father at Abbot, Merkt and Company in New York City. Later in his career, Dick made a switch to wealth management, joining A.G. Edwards as an advisor, eventually acquired by Wells Fargo. Dick enjoyed his careers and active involvements in his clubs and communities, however, his passions were always focussed on family and friends.

His first marriage to Anne Rhodes Nelson in 1964 produced two children, Leslie and Chip. In 1985, he married Pat Whiskeman, the sister of a Phi Gamma Delta classmate at Cornell. Dick and Pat enjoyed life to the fullest, sharing experiences and creating memories with family and friends. Together they embraced volunteering in their communities, reading history, going to the theatre & symphonies, traveling inside and out of the country, playing paddle, tennis, and golf. Dick was a great athlete, a fantastic dancer, and an engaging conversationalist. He will be remembered as a wonderful husband, father and a loyal friend who always lifted others before himself. Dick will be greatly missed.

He is survived by his wife, Pat Whiskeman Tatlow, sister Beedy Ritchie Neiner, two children: Leslie Tatlow Schott and Richard H. Tatlow V, their spouses Charles Schott, Jenifer Tatlow, and four grandchildren.
